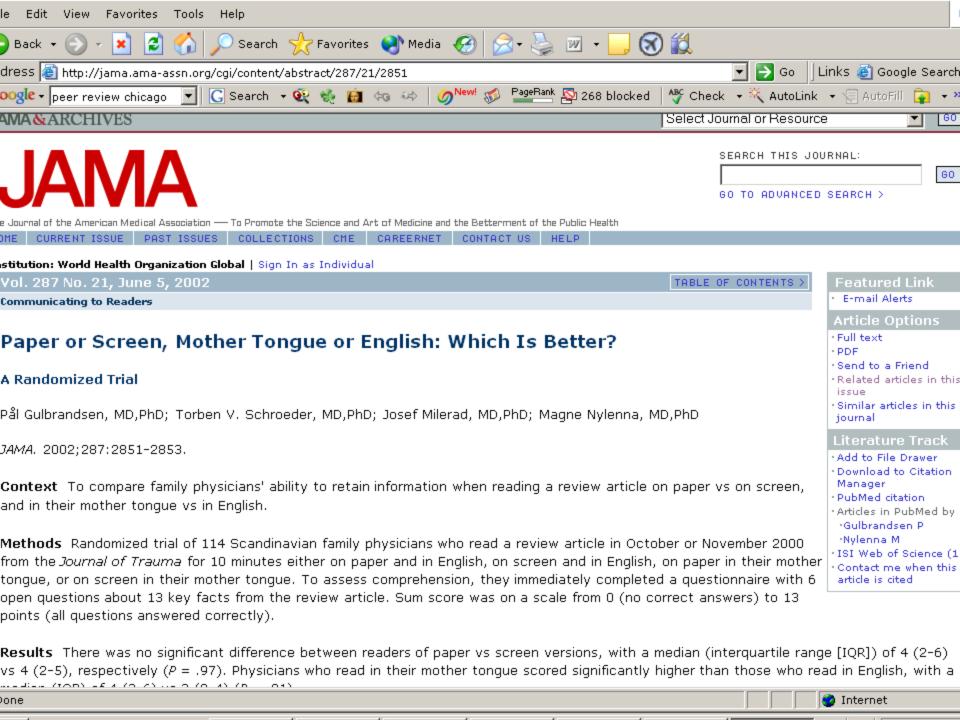

Language of publication

- Authors are encouraged to publish in English
 - International language of publication in science
 - Facilitates publication in high impact journal
 - Favours citation by other authors
- Readers often disagree
 - Prefer information in mother tongue
 - Facilitates comprehension
 - Favours retention



 - We reviewed published English language studies cited in ...

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
- or similar

 - Publication bias in systematic reviews and meta-analyses


Machine Translation

- Improving in quality
 - Never be perfect
 - Always need human translators
- Increasing availability
 - Free on Web
 - e.g. Google translator
 - Increase combination of language pairs









Quality not Language is the Barrier

- Language not a barrier
 - Culture is
 - Nigerian and Pakistani authors are also poorly cited
- Quality is a barrier.
 - Good quality facilitates machine translation
 - Structured abstracts
 - Standardized reporting
 - Consort
 - Statistical tests
 - Increase pool of peer reviewers
- Language should not be an excuse for poor quality
